Anticipatory Response for South West Monsoon Flooding

Through a multi-hazard approach, this 45-day project supported the preparedness of front-line government officials for the South West Monsoon season in the context of COVID-19. With communities expected to take refuge in safety centres managed by the local government, it was crucial to equip these centres with essential resources to mitigate the expected impact of heavy rains, and resulting flooding and landslides, on vulnerable families while also preventing the spread of COVID-19.

ACTED, Oxfam, Save the Children and World Vision Lanka collaboratively distributed hygiene packs and camp management kits in Ratnapura, Kalutara, Kegalle, Colombo, Gampaha and Galle districts.






Objective
