## SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



2021

In line with ACTED's 2020-2025 programme strategy, all of the projects implemented by ACTED globally seek to work towards a world with Zero Exclusion; Zero Carbon; and Zero Poverty, contributing towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

In order to better understand the impact of ACTED's work, and the contributions made by our teams on the ground towards the SDGs, we collect and analyse data on every project, each year, measuring our progress against 26 standardised indicators, which are aligned to the SDGs. In this way, we can better understand the impact that our programming has on the communities that we serve, and can identify areas where we need to strengthen our focus to achieve the targets of the Goals.

IN 2021, ACTED JORDAN REACHED 202,590 BENEFICIARIES ACROSS 9 GOVERNORATES







**324** individuals crossed the national poverty line after having received ACTED's support

**87,024** crisis-affected individuals supported by ACTED with relevant assistance covering their basic needs

**30,952** people supported with **1,482,527** Euros obtained support in cash/vouchers

41,114 individuals have access to basic services

**797** households reported an increased income following project participation

**26,804** individuals obtained adequate quantity and quality of emergency food rations

**100,067** women and girls have benefited from ACTED's assistance (49% of beneficiaries)

**87,077** individuals have benefited from water, sanitation and hygiene activities

**33** water, sanitation and hygiene facilities built or rehabilitated

In 2021, ACTED contributed to reducing poverty and increasing the coverage of basic needs of vulnerable Jordanians and Syrians in Jordan (SDG 1) through:

- creating short-term employment opportunities generating income for 1,249 beneficiaries and providing 781 individuals with post-employment support following their short-term employment rotation, in order to foster sustainable employment opportunities,
- supporting 5,042 Syrian refugees and vulnerable Jordanians with improved access to sustainable agricultural livelihoods opportunities, and
- providing support in the form of e-cards to 19,062 refugees in Jordan to meet their food, nutrition and other basic needs.

ACTED provided vulnerable individuals in Jordan with food through:

- distributing nutritional date bars to 26,079
  Syrian school children in Za'atari and Azraq Camps, and
- providing 725 Syrian refugees with welcome meals, food parcels and/or dates.

ACTED equally includes vulnerable women and girls in all of its projects in Jordan, and ensured equal access to economic opportunities through:

- providing **284 women** with **short-term income-generating opportunities**, and
- offering business development training to 347 women (54% of all participants) and business grants to 327 female entrepreneurs (68% of all grant recipients).

ACTED improved the access to water, sanitation and hygiene in Jordan through:

- reducing the risk of flooding for 33,114 refugees by installing a stormwater network in two districts of Za'atari Camp,
- distributing 30 mobile latrines to targeted households in Vulnerable Outreach Communities (VOC),
- providing 3,221 beneficiaries in VOCs with WASH kits, and
- installing **300 Water Saving Devices** in 4 schools, 10 mosques, and 164 households of Za'atari camp.



ACTED supported the sustainable economic growth of MSMEs in Jordan by:

- Setting and/or scaling up 257 microbusiness through climate-smart agriculture, business and operational capacity building, and grant awards, and
- supporting 76 former cash workers through entrepreneurial and vocational skill training and self-employment grants to launch and expand their microbusinesses.

ACTED contributed to the sustainability of infrastructures through :

- Installing 10.2 km of stormwater network draining excess rain water and reducing the risk of flooding in two districts of Za'atari Camp, and
- rehabilitating a public park in East Amman while also increasing community ownership and strengthening social cohesion among refugees and host communities.

ACTED helped ensure sustainable consumption and production through :

- conducting two assessments in regards to circular economy: one focusing on understanding the market potential and investment opportunities for promoting circular approaches in the country, and a second one aiming to trigger action towards the integration of circularity in humanitarian activities,
- constructing a 150m<sup>2</sup> extension in order for the solid waste sorting centre in Sahab municipality to reach its full capacity, and
- working with two sewing workshops in Ramtha and Sahel-Horan to produce reusable masks from fabric

ACTED strengthened global partnerships & cooperation and contributed to the localization agenda by:

- engaging 14 CSOs in a capacity building plan tackling organization aspects in order to allow them to strengthen their positioning and service delivery.
- Being an active member of the Jordan localization task team throughout 2021.


