

Yemen - Key Achievements 2023

PRESENCE

Acted has been working in Yemen since 2012. With over 12 years of experience supporting communities across the country, Acted Yemen programmatic approach has evolved as the context has changed – shifting from development-focused programming to emergency response following the escalation of conflict in 2015, and more recently, increasing its focus on early recovery and durable solutions. In 2023, Acted implemented both **emergency response** and **resilience building activities** to support IDPs and host communities of 13 governorates exposed to protracted displacement and rapid-onset emergencies caused by natural disasters such as flooding or cholera outbreak. Acted’s expertise of intervention ranges from different sectors of intervention: Camp Coordination & Camp Management (**CCCM**) to Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (**WASH**), Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance (**MPCA**) and Shelter & Settlement (**S&S**).

Acted works across Internationally Recognised Government (IRG) and De-Facto Authority (DFA) controlled areas, maintaining strong communication and coordination with authorities to ensure the positive working relation and local acceptance of its programming.

Acted is committed to partnership for sharing expertise and experience and to strengthen the quality of its programming across all strategic pillars. Acted’s key NGO partners in Yemen are consortia partners under the **Yemen Displacement Response (YDR) Consortium** and **Cash Consortium of Yemen (CCY)**.





Camp Coordination Camp Management (CCCM)

Acted is a leading actor in CCCM in the South of Yemen, managing 102 IDP sites in Aden, Al Dhalee, Marib and Abyan governorates. Acted works with community committees to monitor displacement, needs and services at IDP sites. Acted coordinates the provision of multi-sectoral services by humanitarian actors at each site to ensure and enhance basic services, as well as to create inclusive, dignified, and healthy environments for marginalized groups.

Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

Acted provides emergency and sustainable WASH services to ensure access to basic facilities in areas impacted by protracted crisis or rapid-onset emergencies such as cholera outbreak. Acted's interventions are tailored to the context and needs of the beneficiaries, including water supply infrastructure rehabilitation, water trucking, latrines construction/rehabilitation, desludging, hygiene promotion and hygiene kits distributions.

Multi-Purpose Cash Assistance (MPCA)

Acted meets the critical basic needs of the most vulnerable conflict-affected populations by providing a first line humanitarian response through multi-purpose cash assistance (MPCA). Acted also supports income-generation activities through emergency livelihoods initiatives, supporting business such as honey or coffee producers

Shelter & Settlements (S&S)

Acted provides access to safe, dignified shelter and essential non-food items to households affected by displacement and natural disasters such as flooding. Acted provides both emergency shelter kits as well as long-term quality shelter solutions. Interventions are designed and implemented according to the context and needs of the beneficiaries, including T-shelter, emergency shelter and maintenance kits distribution.
