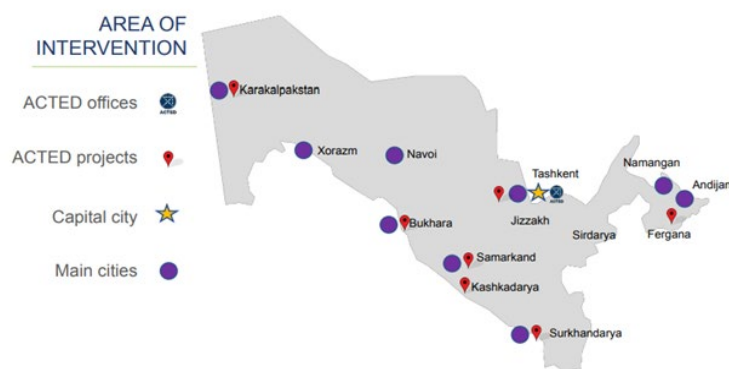

Our presence in Uzbekistan

Acted has been present in Uzbekistan since 1999 and implements nationwide projects that promote sustainable development opportunities to address the country's main challenges. Acted's programmes focus on strengthening the institutional capacity of partners, stakeholders and communities. As a result, Acted has long standing partnerships with communities, government agencies, civil society and international development partners. We currently lead activities in the sector of Civil Society Development, Transparent and Effective Governance, Labour Rights, Women's rights and prevention of Gender-based Violence (GBV), Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH), Inclusive Rural Development, Green Economy and Sustainable Green Transition as well as Biodiversity protection.

Acted is also operationalizing a regional approach in Central Asia. As many of the current development challenges in Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan share similar root causes, given their shared history, we strive for greater harmonisation to capitalise on our 26-year long presence in the region.

Zero Carbon: Supporting Climate Change Adaptation

To build resilience and sustainability, Acted Uzbekistan has focused on **boosting the competitiveness of Community Based Tourism (CBT)** and **promoting energy efficiency and renewable energy** in the sector, through two three-year projects funded by the **European Union**. With the support of the **CEPF**, Acted aims to **strengthen the knowledge of CSOs and their capacities to protect biodiversity**, by involving themselves and their communities in this field and improving their **cooperation with government agencies** responsible for implementing national strategies.



Zero Poverty: Fostering Sustainable, Inclusive Economic Growth

Besides advocating for **improved policy space on the green economy** and **supporting MSMEs in the CBT sector**, Acted promotes **inclusive economic growth**. A regional FCDO-funded project aims to foster a constructive dialogue between CSOs and the government to **encourage evidence-based economic development**. Additionally, Acted conducts essential work in the field of **water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH)**, in collaboration with Mercy Corps in selected preschools of the Surkhandarya region and within a Rural Infrastructure Development Project.



Zero Exclusion: Strengthening Civil Society and Good Governance

Acted Uzbekistan seeks to **improve CSOs' technical, financial and operational capacity**. Under USDRL funding, we work to empower civil society to advocate for enhanced **labour and employment rights of vulnerable citizens**. A USAID-funded regional project focuses on reinforcing principles of **integrated water resources management** and **effective participation of CSOs and women**. With AFD and SDC support, Acted plays a leading role in **supporting local actors to address and prevent gender-based and domestic violence**, while working on advancing women's rights.
