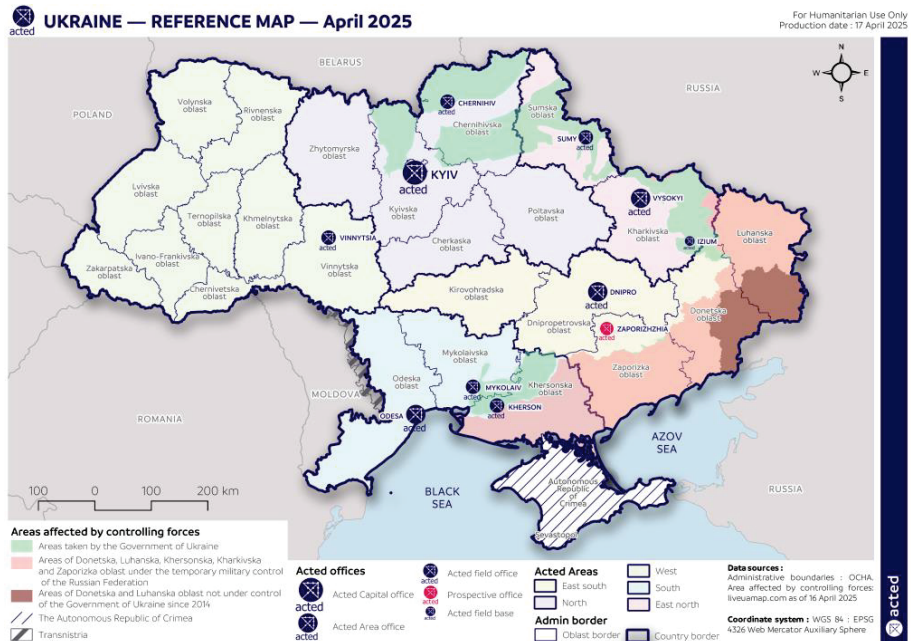

Acted Ukraine

Acted has been **operational in Ukraine since 2015**, responding to emergency and longer-term needs of vulnerable, marginalised, and conflict-affected populations living along the former Line of Conflict (LoC) in Donetsk and Luhanska oblasts, expanding operations into Khersonska and the Sea of Azov area in late 2021. After the Russian invasion in February 2022, **Acted significantly expanded its presence and capacity countrywide**. With 9 offices across Ukraine and over 250 staff, Acted has the capacity to **reach all Ukrainian-controlled territory**. Acted delivers tailored and evidence-based assistance to people in need across three areas of intervention (frontline response, infrastructure reconstruction and early recovery), as outlined below.



Main areas of intervention
