Acted Bangladesh has been operational since 2018, delivering humanitarian assistance to Rohingya refugees in Cox’s Bazar in alignment with Acted’s global 3ZERO vision: Zero Exclusion, Zero Carbon, and Zero Poverty. Through a multi-sectoral approach, Acted implements projects in Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM), Protection, Natural Resource Management, Watershed Management, Information Management, Livelihoods and Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) to support the displaced Rohingya population in Cox’s Bazar camps settlement. Initiatives include reforestation, slope stabilization, and flood control using nature-based solutions and cash-for-work modalities, to enhance community resilience and environmental rehabilitation in coordination with relevant actors. Women are empowered through training and production of hygiene kits, while community-led activities foster environmental stewardship and inclusion across interventions to promote sustainability, resilience, and dignity, ensuring no one is left behind.



## Promoting Inclusion: Acted's Commitment to Zero Exclusion

Acted Bangladesh promotes inclusive humanitarian action by empowering marginalized Rohingya communities, especially women and youth. Through leadership initiatives, community libraries, and skills training, Acted fosters participation, dignity, and equal access to opportunities. Community-led activities and sensitization ensure that no one is left behind, reinforcing social cohesion and resilience in the camp settlements.

## Building Climate Resilience: Acted's Path to Zero Carbon



Acted Bangladesh advances climate resilience in Rohingya camps through nature-based solutions. By planting **70,175 trees**, maintaining **78.89 hectares** of reforested land, and implementing **biological slope stabilization**, Acted reduces erosion, landslide risks, and contributing to carbon sequestration and reducing the environmental impact of the Rohingya response. Watershed management and sustainable land rehabilitation further promote environmental protection, aligning with Acted's commitment to a Zero-carbon future.
