

Acted Bangladesh has been operational since 2018, delivering humanitarian assistance to Rohingya refugees in Cox's Bazar in alignment with Acted's global 3ZERO vision: Zero Exclusion, Zero Carbon, and Zero Poverty. Through a multi-sectoral approach, Acted implements projects in Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM), Protection, Natural Resource Management, Watershed Management, Information Management, Livelihoods and Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR) to support the displaced Rohingya population in Cox's Bazar camps settlement. Initiatives include reforestation, slope stabilization, and flood control using nature-based solutions and cash-for-work modalities, to enhance the community resilience and environmental rehabilitation in coordination with relevant actors. Women are empowered through training and production of hygiene kits, while community-led activities foster environmental stewardship and inclusion through different activities to promote sustainability, resilience, and dignity, ensuring no one is left behind.

Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

Acted provides Site Management Support (SMS) in six Rohingya camps in Cox's Bazar in partnership with UNHCR. In 2025, Acted reached **188,277** people through awareness sessions and empowers **123,584** individuals with **374** community-led initiatives in 2025. Acted manages **24** thematic groups, remediates **127** unauthorized dumping sites as green spots, and cleans **44,235** meters of drains, promoting safer, healthier, and more resilient camp environments in line with its strategic plan.



Community-Based Protection (CBP)

As part of our CBP initiative, Acted has reached **141,023** individuals through awareness sessions and dissemination of key protection messages. To ensure accountability, Acted manages a community-based feedback mechanism, receiving **64,388** feedback entries, including requests, queries, and complaints. Acted also organized **134** peaceful coexistence and social cohesion initiatives and implemented **402** community-led projects, fostering community ownership. Acted established **06** micro libraries in the community centers.

Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR)

Acted strengthens disaster preparedness in Rohingya camps through comprehensive training and maintenance support. The EPR team trained **1,202** SMS volunteers in fire safety response and provided household fire prevention training to **4,787** individuals. Additionally, **340** learning center teachers received water and fire safety training, while **758** volunteers were trained on water and flood safety. Acted ensured operational readiness by maintaining **59** three-wheelers and **585** portable water pumps across all 33 camps.



Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

Acted is actively working to improve sanitary conditions through self-reliance activities. As part of this initiative, **64** women were trained to produce reusable Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) and cleaning kits, fostering local skills and empowerment. Acted distributed **11,000** MHM kits to vulnerable Rohingya women and girls in Camps 1E, 3, and 4, including **66,650** reusable sanitary pads and **11,230** female undergarments. To further support livelihood opportunities, **240** sewing kits were provided, enabling women to continue producing hygiene items and generate income.

Cross-cutting: Natural Resource Management (NRM) and Information Management (IM)

Acted promotes climate resilience in Rohingya camps through nature-based solutions. By planting **70,175** saplings, maintaining **79** hectares of reforested land, and by applying biological slope stabilization. In addition, Acted created income-generating opportunities through Cash-for-Work (CfW) activities. A total of **12,569** individuals were engaged in CfW initiatives to complete **41** schemes, enabling vulnerable households to earn income while contributing to environmental restoration and camp infrastructure improvements.



In **IM**, Acted ensures data-driven decision-making for the Rohingya response. It has conducted 8 major assessments, including the Inter-Sector Needs Assessment (**ISNA**) across **all 33 camps** in Cox's Bazar and the Bhasan Char Needs Assessment (**BCNA**). These efforts identify sectoral gaps and guide strategic planning, enabling humanitarian actors to deliver targeted, evidence-based interventions.
