

REDUCING FOOD INSECURITY OF THE MOST VULNERABLE CONFLICT-AFFECTED POPULATIONS IN EASTERN UKRAINE

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

With the conflict in Ukraine in its 6th year, over 3 million people remain in need of humanitarian assistance, including to meet their food security needs and reduce the use of negative coping strategies. ACTED's 12-months intervention will address the high levels of food insecurity among conflict-affected populations, focusing on the settlements within 5km of the LoC during and just after winter, as this is where and when food insecurity levels are observed to be highest. To reduce food insecurity of the most vulnerable conflict-affected populations in Eastern Ukraine (overall project objective), ACTED will provide unconditional cash transfers to 6,500 individuals.

COORDINATION

ACTIVITIES

- Distribution Round 1 – ACTED will distribute cash to 4,100 people, covering 5 months of assistance (winter period)
- Distribution Round 2 – ACTED will distribute cash to 2,400 people, covering 3 of assistance months (spring period)

THE AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE IS UAH 825 PER HOUSEHOLD MEMBER PER MONTH, IN LINE WITH THE FOOD SECURITY AND LIVELIHOODS CLUSTER RECOMMENDATION.
