

Enhancing employment opportunities and productive sustainable forestation in Karak governorate

ACTED will manage the short term employment of 50 cash-for-workers under a collaborative and resilient ecosystem management project promoting the forestation of Karak. In doing so, the project not only aims to combat desertification and related environmental challenges, but will also encourage social cohesion and improve the living conditions of surrounding communities.



The Jothur Project was initiated in response to His Majesty King Abdullah II's directive to increase green space and preserve forests through national afforestation projects. ACTED is working under the third phase of this project in the Al-Sunaina area of Al-Qasr District of Al-Karak Governorate in line with the project goal to preserve both the environment and species at risk of extinction.

Under the Jothur project, ACTED will support citizen driven climate action by reinforcing local knowledge, enabling the sustainable management of resources. Works to be carried



out will include natural rainwater harvesting, soil health solutions and windbreak techniques to increase the survival rate of both native forestry and productive trees. In order to carry out this work, ACTED will support inclusive economic opportunities through the provision of 50 short-term employment positions.
