





- Highly volatile security environment; over **208,000 newly displaced** in 2025, nearly half since the end of September


Since 2017 The presence of **non-state armed groups (NSAG)** in Cabo Delgado province has led to a major humanitarian crisis, with **over a million displaced people**.

Conflict, climate and economic shocks have disrupted lives and livelihoods for the majority of Cabo Delgado's population.

900.000+ people in **IPC3+** in Cabo Delgado only







Continuous support in **highly conflict-affected, hard-to-reach areas** through Shock-Based **Rapid Responses** and regular **multisectoral humanitarian assistance** (FSL, WASH, CBT modalities, ...) using food insecurity and heightened vulnerabilities as entry points.



Build linkages between life-saving assistance and resilience programs

Enabling communities to build resilience in crisis, through supporting Income Generating Activities (IGA), sustainable livelihoods (agriculture, fishery, blue economies, etc.) and resilience programs oriented to self-reliance.



Complementarity

With ongoing interventions and with **other actors in the area**. Acted will work complementing partners' interventions (including in critical locations such as hospitals, schools, IDP sites ...) to maximize assistance impact with the limited resources available




Geographical focus

HRNP prioritized districts, heavily conflict-affected, IPC3+, districts with **higher % of population IPC4** (Macomia, Mocimboa da Praia, Quissanga...)

Multi-hazard Approach

Areas prone to overlapping crisis such as conflict and natural disasters in coastal areas (Mecufi, Metuge, ...), and subject to multiple waves of displacement

Acted Mozambique strives to build **linkages between Humanitarian assistance and development programs** aimed at building populations resilience, and will work to expand operations in **Cabo Delgado and other provinces**.
