EARTHQUAKE EMERGENCY RESPONSE IN MYANMAR

\$20 MILLION TO REBUILD LIVES

On 28 March 2025, a devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake struck Myanmar, with the epicentre just outside Mandalay — the country’s second-largest city, home to 1.5 million people. **More than 2,000 lives lost, nearly 3,400 injured**, thousands more displaced — and these numbers are **still rising**.

Homes, schools, markets, and roads have been destroyed. Power and communication lines are down, making rescue and recovery efforts even harder. In a country already enduring conflict, economic crisis, and widespread humanitarian need, this could become the deadliest natural disaster in years. **We must act now — and act together.**

In Myanmar since 2008, Acted’s team, deployed only a few hours after the earthquake, is now launching an urgent appeal of \$20 million to prevent additional risks arising from the earthquake - disease outbreaks, famines, deteriorating living conditions:

- Capacity to deploy **immediate response** thanks to already established logistics and local networks.
- **Life-saving assistance** (immediate **food, shelter and hygiene**) and **protection** in the hardest-hit areas.
- **Early recovery** through **income generating activities** & community-driven reconstruction.
