Investing in people, especially through education, is key to breaking the cycle of poverty and fostering lasting resilience.

In Pakistan, 44.7% of the population still lives below the poverty line (World Bank, 2025). Despite modest economic growth (GDP +2.38% in 2023–2024, Pakistani Ministry of Finance), human capital indicators remain critically low, with a literacy rate of only 60% (Pakistan Economic Survey, 2025).

That's why Acted has been committed to delivering **Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) initiatives since 2005**. For more than 8 years, this commitment has taken shape as a key component of the 10-year AALTP programme, equipping young people with the skills they need to access sustainable jobs and build a better future.

This long-term commitment to education will continue until 2027 — because we know that empowering people is the best way to build a more inclusive and resilient tomorrow.



Supporting Graduates Beyond Training

Acted ensures **long-term impact** by supporting trainees even after graduation. Graduates receive toolkits to launch their own small businesses or offer services.

Acted also facilitates **connections with local employers** through cooperation agreements, enabling trainees to settle down and start their own business or find stable employment matching their newly acquired skills.
